Financial Reports and Approvals

David Birdsall, Business Director, reviewed bank balances and presented claims to the Board highlighting significant items, among them: First Installment of Distribution of 2020 Income, First Quarter 2021 Sewer Rents, Payroll Related Items, Vehicle Purchases, Westchester County Eastview Project Phase 1 Debt Service, and the UV Project Review Application Fee.

Approval of Claims: Trustee Murphy made a motion to approve 94 claims totaling \$1,951,753.00. Trustee Seligson seconded the motion, all in favor:

Trustee Seligson requested that, in the future when WJWW needs to replace vehicles, they consider a hybrid or electric option. Trustee Seligson shared that the TOM finds that the savings in gasoline, offsets a higher vehicle price tag. Trustee Seligson also requested a quarterly update of fees associated with the services of the WJWW Special Counsel as well as those of the WJWW Labor Attorney.

^{*}Trustee Belmont signed into the virtual meeting at 3:43 p.m., but due to a technical issue was unable to fully participate at this meeting.

General Administration:

• Rye Lake Filtration Plant: Lori Lee Dickson, General Counsel, explained that WJWW held a 30-day Public Comment period on the Draft Scope, a document that will eventually determine the breadth and depth of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement. WJWW decided to extend the Public Comment period by two weeks and will continue to accept written comments submitted by mail and email (at SEQR@wjww.com). The new deadline for written comments related to the Draft Scope, is May 10, 2021. General Counsel shared that there have been substantive comments received already and the WJWW team is excited to take them into consideration and incorporate them into a revised Draft Scope, which will then be presented to the Board for consideration. All appropriate parties who were notified of the original comment period, such as Involved and Interested agencies, have been notified of the extension.

Lori Lee Dickson, General Counsel, presented two Nelson Pope Voorhis proposals related to Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessments required for the transfer of the two properties for the Filtration Plant. It was explained that Phase 1 is a first step in the process and provides the necessary due diligence required for these transactions to take place once SEQR is completed. General Counsel also explained that some preliminary Phase 1 work had been done on the Westchester County land, but will be updated as the County has requested. The proposals are similar in terms of the assessments to be done, except one is for the property to be acquired from Westchester County and the other is for the property currently owned by WJWW, adjacent to the airport. It was noted that both properties are of equal acreage.

Trustee Murphy made a motion to approve the Nelson, Pope and Voorhis proposal for Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessments related to the Westchester County Property (Project Site Parcel), in the estimated amount of \$2,400. Trustee Seligson seconded the motion, all in favor:

Paul Kutzy, Manager, stated that a postcard will be sent out to alert/notify customers about the filtration plant microsite and the SEQR process. WJWW has taken steps to inform the public, but the postcards will reiterate that the microsite has been created, contains factual information and that it is a good source of information with regard to the SEQR process.

• UV Facility: Lori Lee Dickson, General Counsel, reported that the UV Facility has been placed on this evening's TVOH Planning Board meeting agenda. The Planning Board has requested that the WJWW team reintroduce this project to them, due to the long hiatus. It was explained that WJWW's goal for tonight's presentation is to have the Planning Board set a public hearing date for next month.

Frank Arcara, General Superintendent, updated the Board on the following:

- Purchase Booster Pump Station Upgrades and PRV: This joint capital project has been placed on this evening's TVOH Planning Board meeting agenda for approval of generator pads which need to be installed.
- Over the last two weeks, WJWW Distribution staff have done six service line renewals and have been busy pre-paving in the TVOH and VOM. It is expected that this pre-paving work will be done in the TOM soon. Operations staff took 141 samples, checking for various parameters and all results have come back within normal ranges.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the New York City Water Board (the "Board") will consider an increase in the rate charged for water supply made available to customers outside of New York City from either the Croton or Catskill and Delaware systems of the water supply system of the City of New York (the "City"). The basis for this increase is contained in a report prepared by the Amawalk Consulting Group LLC, rate consultant to the Board, which sets forth the cost of water supply provided to customers located north of New York City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the hearing will be held via teleconference.

It is proposed that the following rate changes become effective as of July 1, 2021:

- The regulated rate for water supply provided to users located north of New York City that is within the allowance quantities set forth in Section 24-360 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York will be increased by a percentage not to exceed 9.0% to a rate not to exceed \$2,057.98 per million gallons.
- The rate for water supply provided to users located north of New York City that exceeds the allowance quantities set forth in Section 24-360 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York will be increased by a percentage not to exceed 2.76% to a rate not to exceed \$5,355.07 per million gallons.

Therefore, in accordance with Section 1045-j(3) of New York Public Authorities Law, a public hearing will be held by teleconference at 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 3, 2021, accessible by telephone by dialing 347-921-5612 and entering access code 781 703 195 #.

As requested, D&B Engineers and Architects (D&B) is pleased to submit this technical scope of work and cost proposal to provide technical assistance to Westchester Joint Water Works (WJWW) 687 Weaver Street Station located in Larchmont, New York, related to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) Chemical Bulk Storage (CBS) regulations. The tanks to be included in this assignment include the 3,000-gallon and 200-gallon aboveground steel tanks utilized to store sodium hydroxide at the WJWW 687 Weaver Street Station facility.

In order to provide the appropriate level of effort necessary to complete this project, D&B has organized the project into the following tasks:

SCOPE OF WORK

Task 1 - Annual CBS Tank Inspections

The CBS tanks must be inspected on an annual basis in accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 598.7(b). Under this task, D&B will conduct the required annual inspection of the two regulated caustic tanks at the 687 Weaver Street Station. The annual inspection will consist of a thorough external visual inspection of the tank system, associated pumps and piping, secondary containment area and chemical transfer area.

D&B will document the results of the annual inspections in an inspection report for the facility. In accordance with the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 598.8(b), the inspection reports will include:

- Facility Registration Number;
- Identification number for tank, piping or equipment tested or inspected;
- Date of test inspection;
- Results of tests and inspections, including a report on the condition of piping, tank and ancillary
 equipment, expected life of service and need for repair;

- Test and inspection methods utilized;
- Certification by the engineer or technician that the test or inspection has been performed in a manner consisted with the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 598;
- Statement of engineer or technician's qualifications;

- Business address of engineer or technician; and
- Signature of engineer or technician.

In addition, the inspection report will provide a list of concerns identified during the annual tank inspections, as well as recommended corrective actions. During the on-site inspection, D&B will be able to assist WJWW with immediately addressing deficiencies such as the correction of tank and fill port labeling. As part of Task 1, D&B will update the NYSDEC CBS Registration for the two tanks at the Weaver Street Station.

An electronic copy of the draft inspection report will be provided to WJWW for review and comment. Any technical comments provided by WJWW on the draft report will be incorporated into the final inspection report. Two copies of the final inspection reports will be prepared and submitted to WJWW.

Task 2 - Preparation of Update to Spill Prevention Report

In accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 598.1(k), WJWW is required to maintain a Spill Prevention Report (SPR) for each regulated facility. The report must be reviewed and updated at least annually, or whenever a significant release occurs or a substantial modification is made to the facility.

Under this task, D&B will update the existing SPR for the WJWW 687 Weaver Street Station. In order to update the SPR, D&B will conduct an on-site visual regulatory assessment of the tank system. The existing SPR will be reviewed for regulatory compliance and updated, as necessary, to conform to the NYSDEC revised chemical bulk storage regulations effective October 11, 2015, the document entitled, *DER-26/How to Prepare a Spill Prevention Report for a Chemical Storage Facility*, as well as the following elements:

- A copy of the registration application and certificate issued under 6 NYCRR Part 596.2;
- Management approval of the report evidenced by the signature of the principal executive officer or authorized representative;
- An up-to-date facility site map of sufficient detail to locate and identify tanks systems and transfer stations;
- The name, signature and license number of the Professional Engineer licensed in New York State who prepared the plan;
- A list of releases that have occurred during the past 5 years;

- An identification and assessment of potential causes of spills, leaks and releases at the facility;
- Compliance status report for each chemical bulk storage tank located at the facility;
- Records which must be kept on-file and made available to NYSDEC;

- A spill response plan.

An electronic copy of the draft SPR will be provided to WJWW for review and comment. Any technical comments provided by WJWW on the draft SPR will be incorporated into the final SPR. Two copies of the final SPR will be prepared and submitted to WJWW. The final SPR will be certified by a Professional Engineer licensed to practice in New York State.

Based upon the estimated level of effort required to undertake the scope of work described above, D&B will complete the project for the Not-To-Exceed amount of \$3,900. If you are in agreement with the above, please sign below and return a copy to my attention.

One 5,000-gallon fiberglass-reinforced plastic (FRP) aboveground storage tank (AST) utilized for the storage of sodium hydroxide at the WJWW 4195 Purchase Street Booster Station has been included for this assignment.

- Results of tests and inspections, including a report on the condition of piping, tank and ancillary equipment, expected life of service and need for repair;
- Test and inspection methods utilized;
- Certification by the engineer or technician that the test or inspection has been performed in a manner consisted with the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 598;
- Statement of engineer or technician's qualifications;
- Name of engineer or technician;
- Business address of engineer or technician; and
- Signature of engineer or technician.

In addition, the inspection report will provide a list of concerns identified during the annual tank inspection, as well as recommended corrective actions. During the on-site inspection, D&B will be able to assist WJWW with immediately addressing deficiencies such as the correction of tank and fill port labeling.

An electronic copy of the draft inspection report will be provided to WJWW for review and comment. Any technical comments provided by WJWW on the draft report will be incorporated into the final inspection report. Two copies of the final inspection reports will be prepared and submitted to WJWW.

Task 2 - Spill Prevention Report Review and Update

In accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 598.1(k), WJWW is required to maintain a Spill Prevention Report (SPR) for each regulated facility. The report must be reviewed and updated at least annually, or whenever a significant release occurs or a substantial modification is made to the facility.

Under this task, D&B will update the existing SPR for the WJWW 4195 Purchase Street Booster Station. In order to update the SPR, D&B will conduct an on-site visual regulatory assessment of the tank system. The existing SPR will be reviewed for regulatory compliance and updated, as necessary, to conform to the NYSDEC revised chemical bulk storage regulations effective October 11, 2015, the document entitled, DER-26/How to Prepare a Spill Prevention Report for a Chemical Storage Facility, as well as the following elements:

- A copy of the registration application and certificate issued under 6 NYCRR Part 596.2;
- Management approval of the report evidenced by the signature of the principal executive officer or authorized representative;
- An up-to-date facility site map of sufficient detail to locate and identify tanks systems and transfer stations;
- The name, signature and license number of the Professional Engineer licensed in New York State who prepared the plan;

- A list of releases that have occurred during the past 5 years;
- An identification and assessment of potential causes of spills, leaks and releases at the facility;
- Compliance status report for each chemical bulk storage tank located at the facility;
- Records which must be kept on-file and made available to NYSDEC;
- Evidence of financial responsibility, if required by 6 NYCRR Part 598.11; and
- A spill response plan.

An electronic copy of the draft SPR will be provided to WJWW for review and comment. Any technical comments provided by WJWW on the draft SPR will be incorporated into the final SPR. Two copies of the final SPR will be prepared and submitted to WJWW. The final SPR will be certified by a Professional Engineer licensed to practice in New York State.

Based upon the estimated level of effort required to undertake the scope of work described above, D&B will complete the project for the Not-To-Exceed amount of \$3,900. If you are in agreement with the above, please sign below and return a copy to my attention.
